NORTHERN & SOUTHERN RECYCLING CENTERS

The Ocean County Northern Recycling Center consists of a 60 acre site which includes a single stream facility with state of the art processing equipment, an education center, two large compost fields, a backyard compost demonstration area, 24-hour resident drop-off recycling center and a special waste drop-off area. The 24-hour resident recycling center and special waste area is located at 601 New Hampshire Ave., Bldg. #68 Lakewood Township. The leaf and brush drop-off areas as well as the compost and wood chip pick-up areas are located at the 535 Oberlin Avenue entrance. If you have any questions please call **732-367-0802**.

The Ocean County Southern Recycling Center located in Stafford Township consists of a recyclables transfer station, a 24-hour resident drop-off recycling center, a special waste building and a compost facility. The resident recycling drop-off center is located at 350 Haywood Road and the special waste, leaves, brush, compost and woodchips is located at 379 Haywood Road Building #105. RECYCLING COLLECTION

The New Jersey Mandatory Recycling and Source Separation Act and the Ocean County Recycling Plan require municipalities to make provisions for the collection of residential recyclables including: bottles and cans, newsprint, cardboard and mixed paper.

The curbside collection of recyclables varies significantly with many municipalities providing weekly collection and others providing bi-weekly collection. All municipalities are required to make provisions to collect the mandatory recyclable material from residential areas. Many coastal communities have a summer and winter collection schedule to accommodate increases in quantities generated by summer vacationers. A number of municipalities also provides a drop-off center where residents can bring recyclables. Please review the table on pages 6 and 7 for details on drop-off centers. In addition, municipalities are responsible for the collection of bulky items and appliances. Please contact your municipal recycling coordinator to obtain information on procedures and fees.



MUNICIPAL FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

2014 Recycling Revenue Sharing Program:

Ocean County shares 50/50 with the municipalities from the sales of recyclables processed at the Materials Processing Facility at the Ocean County Northern Recycling Center in Lakewood Township. The County returns revenues to each municipality that participates in the County's recycling program. Since the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders began the recycling revenue sharing program in 1995 almost **\$16 million** has been returned to municipalities. The more your town recycles the greater the economic benefit will be. Total savings for 2014 to the towns for voiding tipping fees at the landfill was more than **\$5.6 million!!!** The money can be used to fund existing recycling programs such as improvements to existing recycling drop-off centers, purchase roll off containers or other projects deemed appropriate by the town. Towns received revenue checks that totaled anywhere from \$639.00 for Mantoloking and to \$125,000 for Toms River for their recycling efforts. For 2014 Ocean County returned over **\$708,000** to its municipalities through recycling revenue sharing. The average payout for municipalities in 2014 was **\$9.17 per ton**, and Ocean County municipalities recycled almost **79,000 tons** of material!



SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING PROGRAM

When the Single Stream Recycling program began early in the summer of 2010, (where you could place your bottles, cans, glass containers, mixed paper, newspaper and corrugated in one bin), it was with the idea that it would increase recycling tonnage and make it easier for residents to recycle. Although recycling percentages have increased, we've also seen an increase in unacceptable materials and garbage that is ending up in resident's recycling containers. One of the major **DON'Ts** is plastic bags. **DO NOT PUT MATERIALS IN PLASTIC BAGS AND/OR LOOSE PLASTIC BAGS IN THE RECYCLING BIN.** Plastic bags wreak havoc on the machinery at the Ocean County Northern Recycling Processing plants in Lakewood. It causes down time due to the removal of the bags getting caught up in the equipment. The entangled bags also reduce the sorting efficiency of the equipment, resulting in plastic bottles winding up in the paper product. (See picture on left). Just because something is made of plastic **DOESN'T** mean it is accepted in the county's single stream recycling program. Do not go by the recycling symbol on the container or product. ♻️ Plastic grocery or retail shopping bags, Ziploc, bread, cereal, salt, ice, produce & dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, case-over wraps & bubble wrap can be brought to local grocery and retail stores such as Target, A & P, Kohls, Pathmark, Stop & Shop & Super Fresh to be recycled into deck-

ing lumber and other products. Look for the recycling bin near the entrance or customer service desk.

ACCEPTED MATERIALS ONLY: PLASTIC CONTAINERS where the neck is smaller than the base of the container. i.e. beverage, shampoo, laundry/dish detergent, milk jugs, condiments. **CANS:** aluminum, steel & tin, empty aerosol. **CORRUGATED:** cardboard & pizza boxes(clean & flattened) **MIXED PAPER:** magazines, catalogs, junk mail, envelopes, office, computer & school papers, newspapers plus inserts, brown paper bags, construction & wrapping paper, greeting cards. **DO NOT TIE OR BUNDLE PAPER. NO PHONE BOOKS.** They are collected separately. **IF IT IS NOT LISTED HERE IT DOES NOT BELONG IN YOUR RECYCLING BIN OR AT THE COUNTY'S TWO RECYCLING DROP OFF CENTERS. REMOVE ALL CAPS, LIDS & PUMPS AND THROW IN TRASH.**

UNACCEPTABLE: dairy tubs, (i.e. margarine, yogurt, sour cream); motor oil bottles, fast food containers, restaurant containers. Chip board or gray board (i.e. cereal, spaghetti, gift boxes.) **NO MIXED RIGID PLASTICS** (collected separately - see list below.)

The Ocean County Landfill is privately owned, and utilizes a double composite liner system that is seven feet thick. The Ocean County Landfill is located on Route 70 in Manchester Township.

Pre-registration is required. Registration is on a first-come first-served basis.

Hazardous waste will not be accepted from businesses, school boards or government agencies. Only Ocean County residential households and farmers are eligible for this free program. A driver's license or tax bill will be adequate proof of residency. Our staff can advise you about any materials you are unsure of.

Acceptable Materials: paints/thinners/boat paint, solvents, pool chemicals, pesticides and herbicides, aerosol cans, auto products, toilet and drain cleaners, silver polishes, oven cleaners, photographic chemicals, rug and upholstery cleaners, fire extinguishers, propane tanks, polishes and bleaches, waste oil and gasoline.

ALL THE ABOVE MATERIALS, EXCEPT OIL AND GASOLINE, MUST BE IN ORIGINAL CONTAINERS

Maximum volume per household is limited to 200 pounds of dry materials and 20 gallons of liquid. Please, no containers larger than 5 gallons.

Unacceptable Materials: radioactive materials, dioxins, infectious waste ("Red Bag" wastes), explosives, unknown or unidentified materials. **NO CONSTRUCTION WASTE OR ASBESTOS.**

PROPANE TANKS

BlueRhino collects and recycles the standard 20lb tanks. To find a BlueRhino nearest you go to BlueRhino.com Propane tanks are NOT accepted at the County's two recycling centers. Check with your local public works yard (see table page 6 & 7) OR ask your local Home Depot, Lowes or propane distributor about their trade-in policy. Scrap dealers may also accept them (see page 8) Ocean County **ONLY** accepts them as part of the Household Hazardous Waste Disposal Program.

Book Recycling

Better World Books accepts all books, soft or hard covered in good condition. There are 4 drop-off box locations in Ocean County. Needles, Syringes & Proper Disposal of Unwanted Household Medication

Do not set out your needles and syringes with your RECYCLABLES. For proper disposal visit <http://www.state.nj.us/health/eoh/phss/syringe.pdf> or call 609-984-6620. **DO NOT flush unwanted medications or pour down sinks or drains.** Traces of certain medications have been found in local waterways such as Barnegat Bay. They harm fish and wildlife. Improper disposal in your trash allows others to divert the substance medication not prescribed to them. OCEAN COUNTY MASTER COMPOSTER PROGRAM

The Ocean County Master Composter Program, which began in 2000, is sponsored by the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders and the Ocean County Dept of Solid Waste Management. The premise of this program is to train a core of individuals to help educate Ocean County residents, on how to manage the organic portion of their solid waste. Training classes, which are offered annually and free to Ocean County residents, are held in the spring or fall and are subject to demand. Although a gardening background would be helpful, it is not a requirement. Once training is completed, volunteers then agree to provide a total of 24 hours of outreach, education and service to promote the benefits of home composting.



Ocean County residents can learn the basics of backyard home composting in "How to" Compost Workshops that are held in the spring or fall each year. These workshops are offered free to Ocean County residents and taxpayers and are taught by the Ocean County Master Composters. Registration is required. Classes limited to 25 people.
